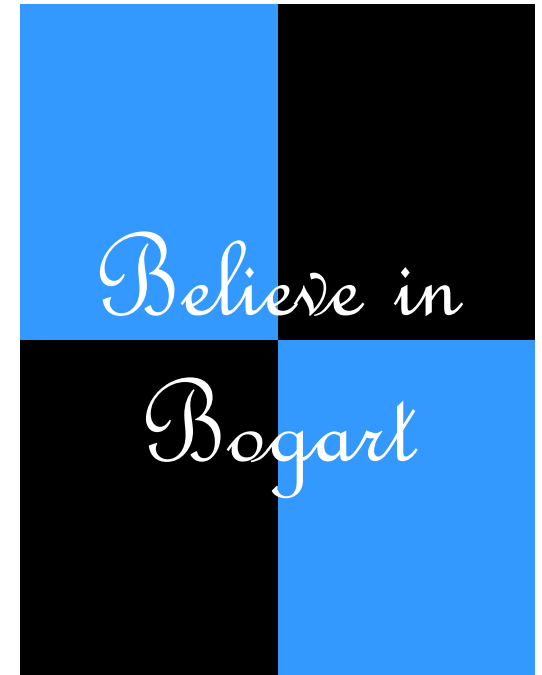

Residential Garbage Pick-up Policy

Items placed in garbage cans that do not qualify as **household** garbage will not be picked up and will be left behind. It is the responsibility of each person to dispose of carpet, wiring, electronics & furniture. These items are not considered **household** garbage.

Limb Pickup Guidelines

Schedule: Alternating Thursdays: April 7 & 21

Note: Limb pick-up is for debris from natural windfall, not for citizen trimming of trees and bushes.

Stack SMALL limbs and branches in a neat pile at the curb...not in ditches, please.

****One 3/4 ton pickup truck load maximum

**** A pile = 6 feet long by 6 feet wide by 4 feet deep

**** Limbs should be no more than 6 feet long and 5-6 inches in diameter. City will accept **pine cones** only if they are put in a container.
