First Order of Business:

Minutes from October 14th Called Meeting and November 11th Workshop were read. John Larkin voted to approve the minutes. David Kilpatrick seconded the motion. Votes unanimous.

## **Agenda Items:**

- 1 IGA with Oconee County for Municipal Court The City of Bogart sought to have an agreement with Oconee County to provide of a Municipal Court in order to enforce Bogart Ordinances. David Kilpatrick motioned to accept and enter into the intergovernmental agreement with Oconee County. John Larkin seconded the motion. Votes unanimous.
- **2 Request for Approval of 2025 Regular Meeting Schedule -** In order to prepare for the next year, the council discussed the dates for council meetings in the next calendar year. John Larkin motioned to approve the schedule that will keep regular meetings on the second Monday of the month at 7PM. Jon Payne seconded the motion. Votes unaimous.
- 3 Repair Stormwater Drainage on Bernice intersection with Jefferson John Larkin presented Carter and Sloope's proposal for drain repairs where Bernice intersects with Jefferson, in order to allivieate the preasures that heavy rains put on the current stormwater drainage. John Larkin motioned to approve payment of \$37.5K to Carter and Sloope to begin bidding for repairs. Jon Payne seconded the motion. Votes unanimous.
- **4- Proposed Road Paving and Stormwater Repair on North Burson** David Kilpatrick has retrieved bids for paving for North Burson Avenue. However, council considered that Stormwater repairs must be considered first before paving can begin on North Burson Avenue.
- **5 Annual Phase II MS4 Report from Beall & Company -** As required, the Annual Phase II Report was read into the minutes, summarizing the actions the City has taken to educate and mediate polluntion in 2024 and maintain EPA compliance.
- 6 Presented RFP from Oconee County for Debris Management & Monitoring The City Clerk introduced the RFP's created by Oconee County. They are two separate bid proposals intended for two sperate companies, wherein the city could contract for debris management and monitoring after man-made or natural disasters. While the city hopes they will never have to use it, after hurricane Helene, it has become necessary to prepare for such disasters.
