2025 City Election!

Two Council seats will be elected to fill a four-year term in the November 4th Municipal Election. David Kilpatrick, Greg Maddox, Nathan Seagraves, and Stephanie Stalnaker have qualified as candidates for the two seats.

Early voting will be held at the **Historical Agricultural Building, 125 E. Thompson Street**. Early voting is available from **October 14 to 18, October 20 to 25, and October 27 to 31**. Weekday hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Saturday hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The Municipal Election will be at the Bogart Community Center, 141 E. Thompson Street. Polls will open on November 4 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Public counting of the ballots will commence after the polls close.
